





Safety in the Field Workshop for NGOs

Tokyo, Japan 11-14 November 2025

The UNHCR Regional Centre for Emergency Preparedness | eCentre and Japan NGO Initiative for Safety and Security | JaNISS in partnership with Japan Platform are pleased to call for applications to the Safety in the Field (SIF) Workshop for NGOs, planned to take place from 11 to 14 November 2025 in Tokyo, Japan. This workshop complements ongoing humanitarian initiatives and efforts of aid workers to have a better understanding and awareness on personal security in the field.

What is this workshop about?

Humanitarian and development workers are increasingly called upon to work in complex security environments. Awareness of the threats — and how to respond appropriately to security incidents — can be a matter of life or death. This workshop addresses basic elements of personal security for staff in the field, as well as interlinkages between security and protection.

The event will achieve these objectives through participatory classroom sessions, exercises designed to enhance, build and practice skills, and experience sharing from participants' operations.

Who is this workshop for?

This initiative is designed for professionals engaged in humanitarian or development activities, particularly those working (or planning to work) in high-risk or complex security environments. Participants learn how to improve their own and others' safety through discussion of real cases, exercises and demonstrations, and above all practical application of lessons in simulations.

Participants will include a dynamic mix of staff from NGOs. In the interest of maximising participants' learning experience, we would like to diversify the profiles of the participants. For this particular event, we intend on having NGO participants; (A) whose duty stations are from the Tokyo "metropolis" area; (B) whose duty stations are in "other domestic locations" in Japan; and (C) whose duty station is in "overseas" location. Some of the topics this workshop will touch upon

- The current security environment for aid workers
- Emergency preparedness and centrality of protection
- Identifying and assessing security threats
- Office and residential security
- Threats associated with travel, crowds and mobs
- Weapons awareness: firearms, mines, UXOs and IEDs
- Hostage survival
- Reducing hostility and tension in others
- Special security concern for women
- Stress management and teamwork

Participation criteria

- This event will be conducted in the English language; thus applicants must be highly proficient in written and spoken English language.
- Applicants must have a minimum of one year of working experience in the related field.
- Applicants for the **Security in the Field (SIF)** must be able to participate in <u>all 4 days (11-14 Nov)</u> of the workshop.

Other qualifications:

- (A) To qualify as an applicant from "Metropolis" areas:
 - o Your duty station must be located within 2hrs from JR "Ochanomizu station".
- (B) To qualify as an applicant from "Other Domestic" areas:
 - o Your duty station must be located <u>further than</u> 2hrs from "Ochanomizu station".
- (C) To qualify as an applicant from "Overseas" areas:
 - o Your duty station should be in overseas location

Participation fee
